CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson for the Day Articles of the Altar

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

A big part of today will be focused on a preschoolers' natural willingness to absorb new words. We will introduce the children to the names and functions of the materials present on the altar during the Eucharist (linens, cross, chalice, paten).

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Today we will use a miniature altar to tangibly experience the function of the materials on the altar during the Eucharist. Just as we bring out the "special" plates, linens, etc. during a special family meal, the priests use specific materials each week to prepare the table for Eucharist.

Upper Elementary-Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Building on our introduction to the Noah narrative two weeks ago, the children will explore God's frustration with human sinfulness and the cleansing power of the floodwaters. We will also reflect on the floodwaters in light of our own Baptism.

Confirmation-Youth Cottage

This week our Confirmation class will continue their exploration of the Nicene Creed. Do we believe all that the Creed affirms? What objections do we have? Is that a problem? Should it be? Join us as we deliberate upon the Creed together.

Redeemer Youth Group-Youth Cottage

RYG will meet by this Sunday from 4-6 pm at the cottage. After some outdoor fun we will have an activity celebrating All Saints and All Souls Days. Please join us!
