CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson for the Day The Peace

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

Throughout the year in Catechesis I, children practice parts of the liturgy in order to prepare them for full participation in worship. Today they will be introduced to the gesture of the Passing of the Peace.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

There is a lot of movement within the liturgy. Each of these movements and gestures serves a particular role. Today we will explore the ways in which the Peace is more than just a way to say hello and shaking hands (in non-Covid times).

Upper Elementary/middle school - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

We will wrap up our three-part series on Noah and the Flood this week. The children will explore the importance of covenant both in terms of the Noah story and the Biblical narrative as a whole.

Confirmation-Youth Cottage

This week our Confirmation class will continue their exploration of the Nicene Creed. Do we believe all that the Creed affirms? What objections do we have? Is that a problem? Should it be? Join us as we deliberate upon the Creed together.
