Overall Need Statement:

Cardiovascular Disease is the leading cause of death in both men and women in the United States. Despite the advances in treatment of cardiovascular disease it still accounts for over 1/3 of deaths in the United States. The rapidly changing healthcare environment often leaves the entire CV team struggling to find the most current and up to date information needed to manage their patients. Information on new treatment guidelines, managing specific diseases, and optimizing the multidisciplinary care of the cardiac patient will provide the CV team an opportunity to identify the most current available information for the clinical care of their patients.

Overall Goal Statement

The overall goal of this activity is to improve patient care by increasing learner competence in diagnosing heart failure, valvular heart disease, atrial fibrillation, the differences in stress testing and CT imaging, ischemic heart disease, cardiomyopathies. The learner will also increase their knowledge in healthcare disparities and the top ten trials from ACC.21.

Symposium Objectives

OBJECTIVE 1	Discuss the treatment plans for two clinical trajectories: improving or worsening of Heart Failure patients with reduced ejection fraction.
OBJECTIVE 2	Discuss strategies to identify and treat patients with valvular heart disease according to the ACC/AHA Guidelines.
OBJECTIVE 3	Evaluate the utility of electronic devices for identifying and managing atrial fibrillation.
OBJECTIVE 4	Discuss the role of the social determinants of health and socioeconomic status which impact healthcare disparities and the outcomes of patients with cardiovascular disease.
OBJECTIVE 5	Discuss the pros and cons of CT angiography and stress testing in the evaluation of ischemic heart disease.
OBJECTIVE 6	Discuss how to interpret high sensitivity troponins in the evaluation of a patient presenting with chest pain.
OBJECTIVE 7	Discuss the latest and most important cardiology trials that can impact our patient care.

OBJECTIVE 8 Discuss the new guidelines and treatments of amyloid cardiomyopathy.
