Safehope provides support services to survivors and their families who have experienced domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking or mass violence. Safehope advocates helped more than 949 survivors in Harvey, McPherson and Marion counties this past fiscal year. We have illustrated several statistics and services provided as an agency during that time.

The agency kept going while the pandemic slowed down the world in so many ways. Operations looked a little different as we learned to find our way through the system changes and new safety concerns for survivors. Fleeing from violence or abuse and seeking safe shelter had new challenges for families as they managed the work from home routines or remote school schedules for their children. Your support and backing has enabled services to continue successfully for the survivors.

Safehope will continue seeking expansion and improvement of the Crisis Shelter. The agency is expecting federal support to remodel part of the current administrative offices into new crisis shelter units. While these funds will be a positive step in covering part of the expenses, your support will be vital for the renovation success.

With your support and donations needed more than ever, Safehope will continue the essential services for men, women and children affected by domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking or mass violence.

17,896 services to 949 survivors

Services such as emotional support, food, clothing, shelter, court system advocacy, medical accompaniment, and support group.



3,760 helpline calls

This is over 10 calls per day where comforting, competent assistance was provided during times of crisis or for resources.



59 survivors, 1,039 nights in shelter

Our four bedrooms (lowered to two bedrooms for social distancing practices for part of the year) provided a safe haven for 59 victims and their children.



286 Police Response Advocate calls

Police Response Advocates accompanied law enforcement officers to 286 domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking calls in Harvey County.



Assisted with 229 protection orders

Staff assisted survivors attempting to obtain Protection From Abuse or Protection From Stalking, Sexual Assault, or Human Trafficking orders.



955 therapy appointments

Safehope Resiliency Center conducted 955 therapy appointments with 108 different survivors; of those appointments, 185 were conducted with 19 survivors affected by mass violence.
