Dear Disciples and Friends at Prince of Peace,

Are we entering a new reality for congregational life? What does the future hold?

Current observations from around the country suggests an emerging congregational participation pattern are trending at 30-40-30. (Church Answers, Thom S. Rainer)

The first observation is that compared to pre-COVID numbers, about 30% of church worship attendance has disappeared. Here at PoP, we can confirm that about 30% or higher of members have not returned to worship services.

About 40% of the attendees that have returned are only marginally committed. They may show up once a month, twice a month at most. They are attendees only. They tend not to be involved in ministries in the church. And they do not significantly support the church financially. This trend does not seem to be currently reflected at PoP. The majority of those who have returned are participating and supporting our mutual ministry.

Another 30% of the pre-COVID numbers have returned, and they are significantly committed to the church. They are involved in ministry and volunteer positions. They fill gaps where others have dropped out and step up to serve in new ways inspired by attempts at being the church during the pandemic. They attend worship services with almost weekly faithfulness. And they are committed financial supporters of the church. Prince of Peace also affirms this percentage and is blessed to have these disciples.

In summary, the 30-40-30 number represents the dropouts (30%), the marginally committed (40%), and the committed (30%).

What does this mean for the future of the Christian church in general and for the vitality of Prince of Peace, Brookfield, specifically? Are we entering a new reality for congregational life? Is this what our future holds?

We will be exploring changing congregational participation patterns in the months to come. If you have thoughts on how we might respond or how to increase the number of significantly committed to PoP speak to a congregational leader.

In the meantime, please prayerfully discern where you find yourself in this 30-40-30 hypothesis for the post-quarantine church. Is God calling you to return to worship after some time away, or to become more involved in our ministry to bless and serve the world, or to continue your commitment to serve PoP in new and exciting ways?

What the future holds for PoP is in our hands with the help of God.

SUNDAY WORSHIP

Sundays at 9:00 a.m. in the building, in-person.

- **No online registration.** Everyone will be, however, asked to sign in upon arrival.
- **Masks are NOW required** regardless of vaccination status.*

Sundays from 10:15 to 10:50 a.m. Sunday School in-person in the Green Room or playground (weather permitting) for children 1st-5th grade. See the Sunday School page on our website for details.

Sundays at 11:00 a.m. outdoor, parking lot, worship with communion. This service will not be on Zoom or streamed. Park in the lower parking lot and walk toward the church with your folding chairs. Bring your own bread and wine or use the kit provided. **In case of inclement weather, service will be broadcast over FM radio in the parking lot.** Those fully vaccinated do not need to wear masks.

The arrangements cost \$25.00. If you would like to dedicate altar flowers in memory of a loved one, to the glory of God, or in honor of a person or event, you can sign up for your chosen date on the Flower Chart between the bathrooms in the Narthex. You also need to fill out a flower request form, which is located next to the Flower Chart, and put it in Rene Tuccillo's mailbox. Your name and dedication will appear in the worship bulletins. If two people sign up for the same date, flowers can be placed in other locations in the Sanctuary, such as on the organ or piano or at the baptismal font. We do not have flowers at the altar during lent.

Brian Muller is the former Minister of Music and Organist at Zion Lutheran Church in Stamford. Prior to Zion Lutheran, he served as Music Director at St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Norwalk, and organist at the Rowayton United Methodist Church.

He began his church career as a teenager, regularly leading music for worship in his home church of Faith Lutheran, New Port Richey, Florida. He went on to receive a B.S. in Music Education and church service at Concordia College, Bronxville, NY, where he studied organ under Dr. Richard Heschke and choral conducting under Ralph C. Schultz. Establishing a new home in Norwalk shortly after graduation, he returned to school and received his M.S. in Music Education at Western Connecticut State University, where he continued his choral training under Dr. Kevin Issacs.



An active educator, conductor, and musician, he currently holds a post with New Canaan Country School as part of the Performing Arts Faculty and has been the Music Director of the [Norwalk Community Chorale](#) for over 20 years, reshaping and transforming its programs to meet the needs of the community, while striving for musical integrity and growth. He has held membership in the Connecticut Music Educator Association (CMEA), the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), and the American Guild of Organists (AGO). He also served on the Connecticut Commission for the Arts as a music-choral panelist and as a music consultant for the New England Saengerbund Society.

Brian and his wife, Eileen, live in Norwalk and have three grown children, Drew, Lauren, and Kristen, and two grandchildren, Matt and Evie. Other than being big fans of Broadway and anything Disney, when time allows, Brian and his wife spend time either in the mountains of northern Maine or at the beaches of South Jersey.



As we don't have storage room please bring your non-food items after the service on Sunday, October 31.


Julie Parker will be doing the jewelry. Please bring your gently used jewelry to the box labeled for the jewels.

Lutheran Disaster Relief for Hurricane Ida victims

Hurricane Ida made landfall near New Orleans on Aug. 29 – exactly 16 years after Hurricane Katrina. As a strong Category 4 storm, Hurricane Ida's 150 mph winds, torrential rain and strong storm surge caused widespread flooding and wind damage in southeastern Louisiana and coastal Mississippi.


On Sept. 1, the remnants of Hurricane Ida barreled through the Northeast, leaving devastation in their wake. New York, Pennsylvania and New Jersey were hit with historic flash flooding and tornadoes touched down in Maryland and New Jersey. Homes and subways filled with water, cars were swept away and the death toll continues to rise. Meanwhile in Louisiana and some parts of Mississippi, evacuees have been told not to return because many areas remain without electricity and people are struggling to find gas, food and clean water.

Lutheran Disaster Response brings God's hope, healing and renewal to people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world. 
