Mark 6:30-44

#### **COVID Safety Update**

Every month the Session reviews Fairmont's response to COVID-19 in our community and necessary safeguards. After reviewing the latest medical data showing that the seven day average number of new cases in the state of Ohio has dropped to 71, and after receiving medical advice from our own physicians, the Session removed the requirement for fully vaccinated individuals to wear masks in worship at Fairmont.
