Eligibility Criteria for HeLP

- Family/child or legal dependent receives care from CHOA
 - Emergency room
 - Urgent care
 - Inpatient
 - Outpatient at Center for Advanced Pediatrics
 - TCCN practice
 - Rehabilitation facility
 - Other affiliated organizations such as Marcus Autism Center
- Income at or below 200 per cent of federal poverty level
- Child or parent-legal citizen of the US

^{*}The healthcare professional does not need to determine eligibility. This falls under the purview of the HeLP legal staff and is determined after a referral is made, during the intake process.

Referral Sources from Direct Contacts

- Physicians
- Nurses
- Therapists
 - Respiratory therapists
 - PT/OT
 - Speech-Language
- Social workers
- Other healthcare professionals
- Families who have previously used HeLP

^{*} It should be noted that when a healthcare professional is involved, express permission for a member of HeLP's team to contact the patient is required prior to making the referral.

What is HeLP?

HeAD is a partnership between decorns and beyons to help patients and their families with legal lines. HeAD is a free service. You do not need a referral from a decore, social worker, or hospital staff to reach out to HeAD.

Who can get HeLP?

You can get HoLP if:

"Your child receives care at any Children's
Healthcare of Adjusts location:

 Your family lines at or below 200 percent of the Federal Powerty Level; and
 Your legal problem is the kind that we handle.

If you don't know if you meet these requirements, call us to find out.

How do I get HeLP?

- Call as at 404-785-3006. If we don't shower, please leave a restage with your names, phone number, and why you are calling. We will call you back.
- Complete on application. This can be done over the phone.
- Send in any paperwork that the HeLP soft asks for.

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Other Ways to Refer

- Licensed attorneys and informational brochures at each CHOA campus
 - Egleston
 - Hughes Spalding
 - Scottish Rite
 - Center for Advanced Pediatrics
- Self-refer
- Community pediatricians or primary care physicians



Application for Legal Assistance

- HeLP staff member completes intake
 - Completed by telephone or in person
- A legal check-up is part of the intake-designed after the medical H&P
- Families usually present with one issue—others are uncovered
- Details concerning the issue are gathered as well as personal information such as name, address, phone, members of household, income, etc.



Questions Included in the Legal Check-up

- Are you having difficulty getting insurance to pay for services or medications prescribed by the doctor?
- Has anyone's application for SSI been denied recently?
- Do any of your children need accommodations they are not receiving in school?
- Have you or your children experienced violence or abuse in the home?
- Have you recently received any eviction threats?
- Are you able to afford food for your family?




Self-Help or Ineligibility

- Self-help assistance
 - No clear legal issue discovered
 - Example: Child may be eligible for SSI, but family has not applied
 - HeLP can provide guidance in applying for SSI and understanding of the appeals process
 - Do not provide representation if a client is seeking a divorce, but will provide other available resources
- Ineligibility
 - Family income is greater than the income eligibility guidelines
 - Immigration issues

Next Steps in the Process

- If the case is accepted, a HeLP staff member is assigned to the case
- The HeLP representative contacts the family and provides details about the representation
- If HeLP unable to provide representation, HeLP may refer client to:
 - Other attorneys within the community who offer pro bono services
 - Other community organizations such as the Latin
 American Association, Catholic Charities, etc.
